CALL FOR PAPERS:

Research papers are invited from interested academicians, theatre practitioners and researchers for a multilingual national Seminar on "Badal Sircar and Post Colonial Theatres on India: Society, Politics and Performance" organized by the Department of Bengali, Assam University, Silchar in collaboration with ICSSR-NERC, to be held during January 22-23,2025. The abstract (both in MS word and pdf format) should be submitted within 25th December 2024. It should not exceed 200 words. For English, Times New Roman font to be used and for Bengali, Assamese, Hindi and Manipuri, Unicode should be used. Registration Link will be shared to the participants only when abstracts are accepted for presentation in the seminar. Online registration process will be completed by 10th January 2025. The seminar will be in blended mode (both online and offline). Paper presenters will have to submit soft copies of their full papers by 20th January 2025. Paper presentation will be allowed only on receipt of full paper. Full papers should be limited to 3000 thousand words with MLA referencing style. After peer review, selected papers will be published in book form with ISBN.

ABOUT THE SEMINAR:

Badal Sircar, a pioneering playwright of post-Independence India, revolutionized theatre by transitioning from traditional proscenium plays to experimental works that stood upon folk and traditional Indian theatrical presentations. This shift challenged the colonial legacy of urban theatre and also gave voice to the struggles of the toiling masses. Sircar's plays not only presented a critique of social injustices and oppressions, but also his revolutionary approach to theatre evolved the form of "Third Theatre" to encompass a comprehensive theatre philosophy. He dismantled the conventional inter-relationships between the performer, recipient, and performance arena, challenging traditional notions of theatre and its engagement with audiences. By reconfiguring the role of above elements, Sircar created a more inclusive, collaborative, and socially conscious theatre practice that continues to influence contemporary theatre makers. His philosophy not only liberated theatre from its colonial legacy but also empowered it to become a powerful tool for social change and community engagement.

Marking Sircar's centenary, this seminar aims to have illuminating interactive sessions to evaluate the varied ways of countering colonial legacy in theatre, the debates on limitations of proscenium, the journey from proscenium to forms of free theatres and alternative theatres in India. It intends to delve into India's theatrical transformations since the sixties of last century, focusing on Badal Sircar and pivotal playwright-directors- Bijay Tendulkar, Girish Karnad, Habib Tanvir, Mohan Rakesh, Heisnam Kanhailal, Safdar Hasmi, Ratan Thiyam and others- who spearheaded decolonization and innovation. This seminar hope to foster a deeper understanding of post-colonial Indian Theatre's history, key figures, and ongoing influence on contemporary performance practices. This seminar will shed light on the ways in which Sircar's approach continues to shape the trajectory of Indian theatre, inspiring new generations of theatre makers to push boundaries and challenge conventions.
