Comprising sixteen schools and forty-one departments, it is one of north east India's pioneering educational institutions established in 1994. 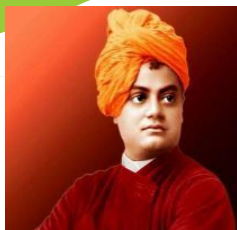

Silchar, one of the largest cities in the north east, serves as headquarters of Cachar district. Situated on the banks of the river Barak River, it is the cultural & the business hub of southern Assam. Bordered by the Barail & Jayantia hill ranges to the north, Mizoram to the south, Manipur to the east, and Hailakandi & Karimganj districts to the west. Silchar experiences a favorable climate with hot & humid summers, averaging an annual temperature of 30°C.
